The Chicago Dermatological Society has chosen Marshall L. Blankenship, M.D. as its Gold Medal awardee. This award is given for outstanding service and academic excellence for one's career. *Only three previous times* has the Society honored other physicians: Allan L. Lorincz, M.D. (1990), Frederick Malkinson, M.D. (1992) and Lawrence Solomon, M.D. (1997). The award will be presented at this year's Centennial celebration.



GOLD MEDAL AWARD WINNER

MARSHALL L. BLANKENSHIP received his undergraduate and M.D. degrees from the University of Illinois. After a rotating internship at the Illinois Central Hospital in Chicago and service in the U.S. Army as a general medical officer, he completed his residency in dermatology at Northwestern University Medical School. His mentors there included Samuel Bluefarb, M.D., Junji Hasegawa, M.D., Fred Levit, M.D., Frank Dunlap, M.D., and Paul Lazar, M.D. During his residency, Marshall read pathology slides with Royal Ihrke, M.D. weekly. Toward the completion of his residency, Dr. Ihrke invited him to share offices in private practice in Oak Lawn, Illinois. Over the next 35 years, Marshall was associated in practice (in addition to Dr. Ihrke) with the late Leon Lando, M.D., John Keane, M.D., Kenneth Bielinski M.D., and Mark Hoffman, M.D.

In addition to his private practice, Marshall spent eight enjoyable years as a faculty member at Northwestern University. Twenty-nine years ago, Marshall joined the faculty of the Department of Dermatology of Rush-Presbyterian-St. Luke's Medical Center. Over the years, he has had the privilege of being associated with Fred Malkinson, M.D., Roger Pearson, M.D., Marianne O'Donoghue, M.D, James Ertle, M.D. and Michael Tharp, M.D.

Marshall has been active at all levels of organized dermatology both nationally and internationally. He was president of the Chicago Dermatological Society in 1976 when the Society celebrated its 75th anniversary. He was on the organizing committee for the Illinois Dermatological Society and served as it s president in 1978. From 1986 to 1990, Dr. Blankenship was a member of the Board of Directors of the American Academy of Dermatology and from 1991 to 1994, served on the Academy's Nominating Committee. He was also a board member of the International Society of Dermatology, Secretary-Treasurer of the Foundation for International Dermatologic Education, and a past Director of the Noah Worcester Dermatologic Society. A former trustee of the Dermatology Foundation, Dr. Blankenship served on the Leader's Society Committee and led the Leader's Society campaign in Illinois in 1990 and 1991.

In 1997, at the annual American Academy of Dermatology meeting in San Francisco, California, Marshall was awarded the National Practitioner of the Year Award. The Award is given each year by the Dermatology Foundation. It was established by the Foundation's Trustees in 1976 to honor those members of our specialty who epitomize the best clinical service to the individual patient. Criteria for the Award include a dermatologist's record of teaching, research, publications, participation in professional societies, and his/her clinical career. "Marshall Blankenship's rich career spans more than 30 years and whether you define accomplishments by research, the number of publications and citations, or visiting professorships, he has made (and continues to make) major contributions to all facets of dermatology," said Dermatology Foundation President Howard V. Dubin, M.D.

ne of Marshall's many interests is travel. His CDS Presidential Address was "Travels of a Dermatologist." Literally spanning the globe, his numerous presentations have been made to assemblies in South Africa, Zimbabwe, Japan, Australia, Egypt, Singapore, Brazil, Germany, and Argentina, to name only some. From a discussion of "Mites Other Than Scabies" before the Hospital for Tropical Diseases in Manaus, Brazil, to "Electrosurgery" presented to the Zimbabwe Medical Association, Marshall has shared his wide-ranging interests and expertise with many international audiences.

Influenced somewhat by Dr. Samuel Bluefarb's stamp collection, Marshall has an active collection of stamps of the United States. Through Dr. Ben Smith and other dermatologists, Dr. Blankenship has developed an extensive interest in "the Master" – Sherlock Holmes. He is a member of the Hounds of the Baskervilles (*sic*) which is the Chicago scion society of the Baker Street Irregulars. In addition he is an active member of four other local Sherlockian Societies and the Sir James Saunder's Society whose members are all dermatologists. Involvement with Sherlock Holmes has led to an interest in books, and a portion of his time is spent in book stores and fairs looking for treasures.

Dr. Blankenship's career would not have been possible without the support of his companion and wife of 43 years, Barbara, his daughter, Kathryn, his son, Marshall, Jr., and his daughter-in-law, Susan. His other passions are gourmet cooking (he loves to read all the foodie magazines), music (he has been a long term subscriber to the Chicago Symphony, Lyric Opera, and Music of the Baroque), theater, sports and history.

SOCIETY SKIN CANCER SCREENING

The Chicago Dermatological Society sponsored a free skin cancer screening at Chicago's North Avenue Beach on Saturday, July 21, 2001. Thirty-five board-certified dermatologists, all A.A.D. and Chicago Dermatological Society members, provided free skin exams. Numerous resident physicians provided education to attendees and distributed sunscreen samples and skin cancer and sun safety information. Contributions from pharmaceutical companies made it possible for the Society to distribute thousands of free sunscreen samples to the 505 participants.

Of these participants seen on a walk-in basis, CDS physicians referred 162 (32%) for follow-up for suspicious lesions. "I feel this referral rate is extremely significant and that this location targets a high-risk population," said Lani Clark, M.D., Chairman of the Society's Skin Cancer Screening Committee.

Media coverage of the skin cancer screening helped achieve one of the main objectives: public awareness. This event was covered by local TV channels NBC, WGN, Polish News, Fox and CLTV, as well as WBBM Radio, WGN Radio, and the Chicago Sun-Times.

The Chicago Dermatological Society plans to organize a similar event next summer (2002) with the hope that through this type of public service and education it will be able to treat skin cancer patients at earlier stages in their disease, and increase public awareness.
